## Course requirements

**Prerequisites:** Scientific Writing, Introduction to Research Methods, Introduction to Epidemiology  
Each student will be required to present their research in two sets. The first will discuss the idea, research question, hypotheses, and initial literature review. The second will discuss possible methodologies.

Following each presentation, a classroom discussion will be facilitated to provide feedback .  
Upon completion of the course, and by the due date, students will submit their research proposal for their thesis.

**Requirements:** Double presentation as described above, hand-in of the proposal in due time

## Final grade components

100% Thesis proposal, according to school regulations

## Course Schedule

Classes will be dedicated to promoting discourse among all thesis track students (colloquium). In addition, some slots will be dedicated to personal meetings with the lecturer.

## Required course reading

Since each student will perform research on a different topic, literature changes between students.

## Comments

Writing the final paper for the program is a challenging process. It can be quite difficult to Develop a scientific idea and incorporate it into an actual research question or research course. This course is intended to allow students to engage in discourse among themselves under the supervision of the lecturer. These discussions will allow a smoother process of research development and adaptation to the requirements of the final project.

This course will serve as a colloquium (a discourse stage) to facilitate the process of proposal development.
